



General School description: Tokyo Metropolitan Kokusai High School is a co-educational public high school established in 1989 and was the first high school in Tokyo in which the whole curriculum was dedicated to international understanding.

In May 2015, Tokyo Metropolitan Kokusai High School was authorized as an International Baccalaureate World School. The school is the first public high school in Japan offering the Diploma Programme.

The school currently offers two courses: International Studies (IS) Course and International Baccalaureate (IB) Course.

The IS and IB Courses satisfy the Japanese National Curriculum (JNC). Aside from the JNC, the IB Course follows the Diploma Programme.

Admissions: The admissions into both IS and IB courses are highly selective. The school offers entrance exams twice per year; April enrollment session (held in January) and September enrollment session (held in July).

Grading systems & Ranking : Kokusai High School uses a grading scale of 1-5 scale (with 5 being the highest) for 1st–3rd year students. The school does not calculate a cumulative GPA. Grades are not weighted.

In addition to the Kokusai 1-5 scale grades, IB predicted grades (1-7 grades, with 7 being the highest) will be given to the IB students in August during the DP 2nd Year. The final IB results will be issued from the International Baccalaureate Organization in December 2025.

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (IS) Course

Subject Offerings: The 1st year students study mostly compulsory General Subject Areas, while in the 2nd and the 3rd year students have a wider choice of elective subjects in Specialized as well as General Subject Areas.

Foreign language courses such as **Chinese, French, German, Korean, and Spanish** are offered aside from English and **Cross Cultural Understanding Courses** that focus on international understanding.
